



Lecturer - Architecture & Construction Management

Farmingdale State College invites applications for a lecturer position in the Department of Architecture and Construction Management focusing on construction management starting fall 2022. The department offers two ABET-accredited Bachelor of Science degree programs, Architectural Engineering Technology and Construction Management Engineering Technology. The primary responsibilities include teaching construction management courses at the undergraduate level, including construction materials and systems, planning, scheduling, cost estimating, plan reading, construction management finance and accounting principles. Additional responsibilities include lab development and experiments, student advisement, recruitment, assessments, and service for the department. The individual must have excellent written and oral communication skills and must be committed to the continuous improvement process and outcome-based assessment of the programs to maintain specialized accreditation. Teaching assignments may include both day and evening courses. May be required to teach in multiple formats including hybrid, online and traditional face to face classes.

The college particularly welcomes candidates with knowledge, skills and abilities that include:

- Interest in participating in student-centered service activities.
- Desire to apply expertise in promoting civic engagement with the College's many community partners.

- Working knowledge to teach Primavera P6, Procore, and/or other project management or scheduling software.
- Experience with multiple construction management data and scheduling platforms used in project management of pre-construction and construction operations, stakeholder communication and collaboration, project commissioning, and project closeout of operational and financial activities.
